

Evidence Based Education System Cell

Introduction

It was being felt since long that the knowledge and skills obtained during the training in healthcare, during undergraduate and post graduate courses are insufficient to carry on lifelong successful healthcare practice and decision making. To make decisions, the practicing professionals even today are largely dependent on obsolete knowledge and expertise derived from unsystematic observations made during his training, which can be as old as his course itself.

Evidence based medicine (E BM) was introduced to do away with this trend in the medical field. It simply means the need for judicious use of current, objective information in making decisions about the care of individual patients. The term was coined to encourage proficiency in judgments by individual clinicians based not only on "experience" but also on experience informed by results acquired in systematic approach.

Incorporation of same principle in all aspects of teaching and learning process to impart the process more perfectly is Evidence Based Education System (EBES) which was adopted by our university with the aim to create individuals skilled in all ways to use evidence to make individual decisions. The adoption of EBES is all the more imperative since the 'Internet Revolution' has provided immediate and easy access to new research.

Many may ask why evidence based? The answer lies in it being scientifically sound, is patient focused, incorporates clinical experience, is thorough and comprehensive, stresses on good judgment, use of empirically-verified treatments in the care of patients, incorporation of research results into the process of care, ability to critically appraise research results.

EBES is thus an innovative emerging area needed for promoting knowledge based learning & self-learning. Sumandeep Vidyapeeth adopted it since its inception (2007) to establish an educational system which to overcome the present shortfalls and to be at par with global education system.

Objectives:

- To prepare health care provider of first contact, capable of functioning independently in both urban and rural environment with special attention to diagnosis prevention and treatment planning of the diseases/health related problems and prevention of same by being abreast to scientifically proven empirical evidence.
- To provide education that allows hands-on-experience both in hospital as well as in community setting with systematic evidence based approach, educational experience that emphasizes health rather than only disease with outcome-based education as a goal.

- To inculcate the technique of reasoning, ability to understand the evidence, the nature and hierarchy of the evidence, critically choose the best evidence and apply it in clinical practice.
- To facilitate a learning experience that will provide the skills to develop, implement and disseminate an evidence-based approach for effective health care practice.
- To provide the doctor/dentist/health care provider who will believe in the value of life-long learning and value the evidence in making clinical decisions over opinion. EBES can lead to better skill and knowledge which ultimately will benefit society.

It has led to formulation of management protocols for diseases prevalent in the region. This has accrued maximum benefit to the patients in form of standard and rational treatment.

On Society

EBES is making teachers and professionals accountable. As a consequence Treatment has become ethical & cost effective and addresses issues of drug and investigations misuse. Above all, it has transmitted a spirit of working on evidence and endeavoring to generate evidence and making this search a life-long process. It will in the long term form database from community centric hypothesis based research, which might at some stage help in formulation of State and National health policies. This will bring maximum benefit to the community, society and the nation at large.


