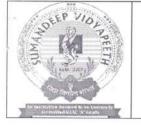

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The department of Clinical Nutrition and Dietetics has started PG Diploma in Clinical Nutrition (1 year course). This course is started as the course under the category of choice based credit system (CBCS). The elements of this course are core subjects and electives. There are total 5 core subject:-

- 1) Advanced Nutrition
- 2) Medical Nutrition Therapy
- 3) Human Physiology
- 4) Public Health Nutrition
- 5) Nutritional Biochemistry

Every student who has taken admission has to attend the above five core subjects and be assessed and there is no option regarding the core subjects. Students have to attend regular classes and appear in the examination and get minimum passing points in all these core subjects as per the rules laid down by Sumandeep Vidyapeeth.

Nutrition compasses every field of science, especially the importance of nutrition is very important in field of human health. Balanced nutrition is imperative to keep away various diseases. Clinical Nutrition and Dietetics department being part of Health sciences university wherein the university has provision of health science courses such as MBBS, MD, DM and MCH in the Medical institute and undergraduate and post graduate courses in the institute of dental sciences. Apart from these courses, there are also courses such as nursing, physiotherapy and pharmacy in this university.

In comparison to Nutrition Science Departments in other Universities, this course provides a unique opportunity to the prospective students of this course to have an exposure to the learning of nutritional aspects in the perspective of human health. The students will get an opportunity to learn both theory and applied aspects in the view of patient care in hospital and community set up. The department has been actively involved in the counselling sessions regarding various nutritional aspects specific to health and disease.



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In recent times there has been a three sixty degree shift in the life styles of people. Shifting from joint family to nuclear family and a lot of focus on being employed by all the adult members forcing them to depend upon outside food suppliers on almost day to day basis. Once a rare aspect of going out or getting food from outside, nowadays it has become to get the food from outside.

As lot of focus will be given in the future on the aspects of food service management, it is not desirable to leave this field to those who do not have exposure to the intricacies of food service management in hospitals and other institutions. The other important aspects we cannot neglect are the aspects of health promotion. Earlier, health promotional aspects were in back stage only focusing on treatment aspects. But now a day a lot of focus is given to the area of health promotion. Medical personnel is involved in the treatment of aspects of population but to improve the health promotion aspects, in addition to specialists such as community medicine personnel, there is a need of getting support from paramedical personnel. Among the paramedical personnel, nutritional specialists and dietetics personnel roles cannot be discounted. Sadly, we do not have sufficient pool such personnel to play supportive role in the health promotional aspects.

By incorporating various curricular aspects in the existing courses as electives and consider them as choice based credit system we can prepare the pool of personnel having exposure to such specialized fields

Keeping these above two points in mind we are proposing two elective subjects in PG Diploma in Clinical Nutrition

1) Food Service Management

2) Health Promotion

Along with the core subjects, introduction of these electives under choice based credit system, would provide ample opportunity to the prospective students who will be qualified in the coming years. These courses will not only provide the opportunities for self-employment but also employment avenues in various fields.

In the department of cardiology, in noninvasive field, we perform 3D,4D and strain rate imaging during echocardiography whenever it is indicated. Exposure to cardiac imaging like CT, MRI and PET scanning which is essential tool for diagnosing various condition (i.e constriction, sarcoidosis, tuberculosis, infracted area)have been given. Lipidology and Genetic counseling clinics are running for young ACS patients and other hereditary disorders.

For terminal heart failure patient (i.e bridge to transplant) various supportive devices like impella, LVAD and ECMO is done. Other devices like CRT,CRT-P and CRT-D are implanted. For complex PCI interventions, imaging modality like IVUS and OCT and IVL and rotablation have been performed. All this is as value added services for our DM curriculum programme.

Neurology

The field of neurology is evolving very fast and there have been significant advances in various neurology subspecialties over the last two years. To keep the students abreast of changing trends in the field of Neurology, we propose following additions in DM Neurology curriculum. We have already incorporated these changes in the clinical practice. Following sections has been added or modified in the present curriculum:

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- Utility and limitations of various noninvasive presurgical source localization methods: PET, SPECT, MEG, EEG-fMRI

- Concepts of functional localization including methods of Wada test, functional MRI, and cortical stimulation and mapping

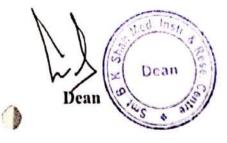

He explained that this inclusion shall train them in making quality hydrocolloid impressions which is a routine method employed in all Dental clinics.

 b. For the Post-Graduate syllabus/Curriculum: 05 exercises on Caries Risk Assessment by Post Graduate Students as part of planning Preventive Procedures in target group or patient. Dean madam elaborated the need to conduct behavioural sciences lectures in I year BDS. After much discussion, the members agreed to include teaching of Behavioural sciences at lectures for First BDS. However Dr. Monali Shah

Resolution: The Member Secretary presented curriculum amendments required in Doctoral (Ph.D.) and Post Doctoral Regulations. He presented the existing as well as the amended / revised curriculum for the Course Work of Doctoral program:

The existing curriculum for Course Work had following subjects:

- 1. Research Methodology and Scientific Writing (Paper I)
- 2. Biostatistics (Paper II)
- 3. Specialization (Paper III)
- 4. EBES in Research (Paper IV)

The newly introduced curriculum amendments / revision for Course Work, has following subjects:

- 1. Research Methodology (Paper I)
- 2. Biostatistics (Paper II)

He further elaborated that, in the newly introduced curriculum for the Course Work - Evidence Based Education in Research, Intellectual Property Rights and Research Ethics, are incorporated as a separate sections in Research Methodology.

After due deliberations and considering the suggestions of members, it was unanimously decided to adopt / incorporate the above specified amendments / revision in the existing curriculum of Course Work. The details of curricular amendments / revision are annexed at Annexure - V.

Agenda no. 6: To introduce Post-Doctoral Fellowship in all the Academic Faculties of the Institution. Resolution: The Member Secretary presented the Office Note (Annexure - VI) regarding introduction of Post-Doctoral Fellowship from Academic Year 2020-21 in the following Academic Faculties:

- 1. Faculty of Medicine
- 2. Faculty of Dental Sciences
- 3. Faculty of Nursing
- 4. Faculty of Allied Health Sciences

He also presented that, the Post Doctoral fellowship is offered in Two modes - Fulltime and by Honorary conferment. The Institution shall confer the honorary Post Doctoral Fellowship to the Teaching Faculties of Sumandeep Vidyapeeth Deemed to be University. He emphasized on preparing the Policy, focusing the eligibility criteria for honorary Post Doctoral Fellowship. The Chairman suggested to prepare the policy and propose the same in the next DPDRB meeting, and shall follow the procedure of seeking application from the eligible Teaching Faculties, on similar lines of that of Research Award.

After due deliberations and as the contents of the Office Note are already incorporated in the proposed Sumandeep Vidyapeeth Deemed to be University's "Regulations for the Doctoral degree (Ph.D.) and Post-Doctoral fellowship", all the Board Members unanimously accepted the Office Note regarding introduction of Post-Doctoral Fellowship in various Academic Faculties, from Academic Year 2020-21 and preparing the Policy for conferment of honorary Post Doctoral Fellowship.

Agenda no. 7: To discuss and confirm the number of Ph.D. Scholars enrolled with their respective Faculty / Subject, along with Supervisors, from the Academic year 2015-16 to 2019-20.

Resolution: The Member Secretary presented the list of Ph.D. Scholars enrolled from the Academic year 2015-16 to 2019-20 to the board. All the Members confirmed the total number of Ph.D. scholars enrolled in last Five Academic years: 2015-16 to 2019-20, along with their Subject, Academic Faculty and Research supervisors. The list is annexed at Annexure - VII.

Agenda no. 8: To discuss and confirm the total number of Ph.D. Awarded / Notified, between the Academic years 2015-16 to 2019-20. ep Vid
