Sumandeep Vidyapeeth utilizes management information system in all its areas of opeartions under various heads as described below: 1. Planning and Development: Institutional Website is put in to full use as a vital information source to all the stakeholders and all important circulars/ notices are made available in website to ensure availability of information any time anywhere. Institution also invites and publishs tender applications through institutional website. Processing New Job application is also made available via institutional website. Application form and document upload for job application is facilitated by ERP module. Institutional ERP has also introduced module for Maintenance through which registration of complain related to maintenance and tracking of the same is managed. 2. Administration: Biometric attendance Management: Institution has biometric attendance management system to track timely reporting of employees. The ERP module of Biometric attendance Management has various features such as individual overall employee report, monthly report, leave reports, etc. Hospital Management System (For both Medical and Dental Hospital): Institution has in house generated Hospital Management Software (HMS) for both Dhiraj General Hospital and K. M. Shah Dental College and Hospital. The Hospital Management Software has following features like Inpatient and Outpatient Management, management information System Report, laboratory Reports Generation and Record, Operator wise Summary Report Management and Treatment payment Management 3. Finance and Accounts: Institution has continued Licensingof Tally Software to handle accounting, inventory management, tax management, payroll etc. Institution has also implemented fee collection management in ERP for admission fees collection, registration of alumni association and registration for the convocation. 4. Student Admission and Support: Operational ERP for Automation of Entire Admission Process which includes Admission enquiry Enquiry follow up Online application forms Generation of merit list Document verification Seat Allotment Tuition fees payment Generation of Admission letter Generation of Enrollment Number Institution has completely online application system implemented for student admission. It also allows uploading of scanned documents required for the admission process. Applicant can register on institutional website and sign in to apply for admission. It also has the inquiry and query portal for admission process. Student Support: Institution also conducted Student induction and orientation programs for newly admitted Undergraduate and Postgraduate students online to avoid physical gathering and meetings. Institution has its own Library repository where various e-contents are uploaded regularly by the teaching faculty of the institution which can be accessed by students for further studies. Institution has also renewed the licensing of various educational software like DelNet, Micro MedEx, TRIP database and UptoDate database. Institution has Urkund online anti Plagiarism software to maintain the quality of research work. 5. Examination: Institution has in house tailored made Examination Management Software for examination evaluation process, result and report generation. Processing of Result, Issuing mark sheets, degree certificates, Examination fees payment, Application for Convocation is automated through ERP.

15.Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

Sumandeep Vidyapeeth Deemed to be University is a large Multidisciplinary teaching intensive Institution with seven health care constituent Institutes offering 157 programs under Medical, Dental, Physiotherapy, Nursing, Pharmacy, Management (Health Care), Audiology and Speech Language Pathology specialties. The entire Institution runs like an integrated higher education system, catering to professional and vocational education of the students enrolled. All the constituent institutes exist in the same campus and functions like a cluster for multidisciplinary approach. To complement the multidisciplinary nature of functioning the institution also conducts language classes for those who require them. There is a separate established literary, arts and cultural committee, well established department of sports and physical education catering to both outdoor and indoor games and sports, a yoga centre. As the institution is a Jain Minority Institution, it is in the process of establishing a department focusing on Jain culture and practices. To offer multidisciplinary programmes successfully, the constituent institutes conduct student-induction programmes to create awareness among students about various learning pathways and career opportunities. Sumandeep Vidyapeeth is registered in the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC); and is in the process of identifying programs where the adoption of online courses is possible, in addition to looking out for collaborations with other HEIs, to offer the programmes with a strong interdisciplinary flavor. However, the Institution is facing difficulty in designing programs for dual degrees as most of the programs are governed by statutory councils Students entering the portals of Sumandeep Vidyapeeth get proper guidance and orientation about the available programs and opportunities, setting pace of their academic journey. Faculty and students are also guided and encouraged to take up online courses on SWAYAM portal which provides an ideal platform for multidisciplinary

education system. Most of the programs offered in the Institution involves teaching by faculty of different departments and are Multidisciplinary in nature. The offered programs in the Institution are skill based and are punctuated with internship, community service and engagement and all the faculty are well qualified, trained and updated in their field. The Institution has an active Competitive Examinations and Career Advancement Cell which offers training to students for appearing in various competitive examinations and gives guidance for advancement of their career. The established placement cell facilitates processes to identify employment opportunities and set up interactions with potential employers. The academic section is well established which contributes to multidisciplinary and holistic education and to research and development in these areas. Sumandeep Vidyapeeth has more than adequate educational infrastructure in terms of books, journals, study materials, audio-visual facilities, e-resources, virtual classrooms and studios and specifically, high bandwidth internet connectivity to deliver courses through various modes to deliver courses through hybrid mode.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Sumandeep Vidyapeeth is registered with Academic Bank of Credits and is working on the process of implementing it, to facilitate students for multiple entry-multiple exit as well as any-time, any-where, and any-level in the programs wherever possible. However, there are limitations on the institution as most of the programs come under health care sector which are strictly governed by statutory regulatory bodies, which have not yet given specific directions for implementation of Credit transfer, Credit accrual and Credit redemption through Academic Bank of Credits for the programs governed by them.

17.Skill development:

The Institution focuses on professional skill development of the students as all the programs offered are skill based. All the constituent Institutes have pre clinical and clinical skill development labs consisting of training models and simulators in all the relevant departments, which are extensively used by students and teachers for the development of clinical skills. The Institution has specialized skill development centre 'Labdhi' which is equipped with high fidelity mannequins. It has one seminar room and six demo rooms. There are different models of Mannequins for techniques like central line insertion, arterial line insertion, injection administrations, advanced airway, tracheostomy, inter costal drain insertion, labor procedure etc. for mastery of skills simulating real life circumstances. American Heart Association approved certificate courses on Basic Life Support (BLS) Advance Cardiac Life Support (ACLS) are periodically conducted in the centre for the students as well as faculty in collaboration with Indian Institute of Emergency Medical Services.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

The institution in its pursuit of Indian Knowledge System has got the permission to start Homeopathic Medical College and Hospital from the academic year 2022-23. The Institution has also got a running Ayurvedic Hospital and is in the process of starting Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital from the academic year 2022-23 There is a separate established literary, arts and cultural committee and a yoga centre. As the institution is a Jain Minority Institution, it is in the process of establishing a department focusing on Jain culture and practices.

19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

Sumandeep Vidyapeeth focuses on Outcome Based Education. All the programs of the Institution have clearly stated learning outcomes in the form of and as stipulated by the applicable regulatory bodies. All these outcomes are achieved by the students along with value additions when they complete the course. The faculties responsibly train the students to achieve stated learning outcomes so that the students are ready to accept the local, regional, national and global challenges in their relevant field through various modes including problem based learning and evidence based journal clubs. Assessment of the achievement of stated objectives in learning outcome and graduate attributes are done for each program/course systematically keeping in mind the parameters to be measured. Teaching schedule is planned as per program/course outcomes to be achieved. The academic programs offered by all the constituent Institutes are designed to meet the changing needs in the health care fields. Curriculum followed in every program offered by the institution focuses on competency, employability, entrepreneurship and skill development. The curricula are frequently enriched on the basis of feedbacks received from all the stakeholders which includes Teachers, Students, Employers and Professionals. The curricula offered across all programs were revised during the last five years. To cater to the changing needs of the stakeholders in health sector globally and to make every healthcare professional

a lifelong learner Evidence Based Practice (EBP) is the main requirement. Hence one of the primary goals of Sumandeep Vidyapeeth is to impart principles and processes of Evidence-Based Education System to the students. To achieve the same, the curriculum of every program is incorporated with teaching of evidence-based subjects in both Undergraduate and Postgraduate programs. Progress towards achievement of learning outcomes is assessed using internal assessments through MCQ evaluations, tutorials; project works, continuous evaluations etc. Being formative in nature the institutes have customized the internal assessments according to the statute guidelines with value additions to gauge the academic progress of the students. Continuous Cumulative Evaluation system (CCES), Mentorship program, self assessment and workplace based assessment are also in place.

20.Distance education/online education:

The Sumandeep Vidapeeth has not offered any distance education or online education programs as all the programs offered are health care related and no specific guidelines were given by the regulatory bodies governing the programs. However, keeping NEP 2020 in mind, courses that will be permitted in online and distance education modes will be instituted.

Curriculum followed in every program offered by the institution focuses on competency, employability, entrepreneurship and skill development.The curricula are frequently enriched on the basis of feedbacks received from all the stakeholders.The curriculum provides special importance to the requirements of stakeholders without compromising on the regulatory requirements and to keep the curricula updated regularly by considering the local, national, regional and global needs, which is achieved through:

a. Evidence Based Practice:Curriculum of every undergraduate program is incorporated with teaching of evidence-based subjects. The Postgraduate programs incorporate EBP in their routine presentations of journal clubs, seminars, case presentations and clinical practice for diagnosis and management of the diseases.

b. Skill based Learning:a state-of-the-art Skill lab in the campus provides American Heart Association approved Basic Life Support (BLS) and Advance Cardiac Life Support (ACLS) certifications.

c. Online Teaching System and Digital Lab: The digital media lab with Lecture capturing system enables developing educational materials and recording the lecture sessions for building efficient teaching learning system.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate physical facilities for teaching –learning, skills acquisition etc.

All the constituent Institutes have teaching learning facilities, laboratories and skill labs as stipulated by regulatory bodies and the students are exposed to peripheral camps for community based training.

Dhiraj Hospital is attached to SBKS Medical Institute and Research Center which is 1350 bedded super specialty teaching hospital and the Institute has Rural Health Training Center at Bahadarpur and Urban Health Training Center at Kothi.

K.M.Shah Dental College and Hospital is equipped with 350 dental chairs and 34 different clinics and laboratories. Departments have simulative labs, phantom heads and working models for preclinical learning.

Department of Pharmacy has 21 Laboratories and a drug information centre. Students do internship at industries to gain knowledge and skills.

The students of College of Physiotherapy, Department of Management, Sumandeep Nursing College and Department of Audiology & Speech Language pathology are posted at Dhiraj Hospital for their Clinical training.

There are skill labs in all the Institutes and Labdhi Simulation Centre is recognized by American Heart Association for conducting Certified BLS courses.

For AYUSH related learning cum therapy, there is an Ayurvedic Hospital attached to the Institution with one acre Herbal garden

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within the campus.

Alternate sources of energy: Roof top solar panels to generate 942KV energy. Biogas plants for generating gas from mess wastage.

STP and water purification plants: Water sewage treatment plant and the recycled water is used for the maintenance of the gardens.

The hospital has more than 80% bed occupancy. 84 specialty clinics are run in the Hospital giving excellent clinical exposure to the students. There are separate operation theatres for all surgical departments. The hospital has central laboratory, central research laboratory and also offers super specialty training in many fields.

K.M.Shah Dental College and Hospital has 350 dental chairs with adequate patient inflow and various facilities for clinical teaching and learning with nine specialty departments having all the latest equipments.

College of Physiotherapy, Department of Audiology and Speech Language Pathology, Sumandeep Nursing College, Department of Pharmacy and the Department of Management have adequate equipment and facilities for as stipulated by regulatory bodies and are associated with Dhiraj hospital for fulfilment of clinical exposure and teaching learning activities.

- The HOI gives comment on the overall report of the individual and then sends it for further review by the Registrar and Vice Chancellor.
- The marks are given on the basis of their performance and the feedback analysis. The final report of performance of teaching and nonteaching staff members are recorded for the purpose of incentives, promotions and the salary increments.

The Institution has Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) Filtration capacity of 1.2 million liters per day. The liquid waste generated in different areas are treated to make it safe for utilization in gardening.

Biomedical Waste Management:

The Institute has tied up with Quantum environmental engineers to handle biomedical waste as per standard protocols and guidelines. All generated biomedical wastes are segregated in colour coded standard polythenes placed over the dustbins in all the identified areas of Hospitals and Institutions premises.

Sumandeep Vidyapeeth is distinct from other Institutions and universities, as it strives towards quality enhancement practices in health education, by following a unique type of teaching and learning method called Evidence-Based Education System (EBES). The performance of the EBES core committee during this year to achieve the objectives of EBES are as follows.

- 5. JBI Collaborative activities: Our center was successful in securing 29,700 JBI points. gLocal solution room was created to spread awareness on Medication Errors in Developing Nations. Total 174 health care professionals were benefited from this.

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate physical facilities for teaching –learning, skills acquisition etc.

All the constituent Institutes have teaching learning facilities, laboratories and skill labs as stipulated by regulatory bodies and the students are exposed to peripheral camps for community based training.

Dhiraj Hospital is attached to SBKS Medical Institute and

Research Center which is 1350 bedded super specialty teaching hospital and the Institute has Rural Health Training Center at Bahadarpur and Urban Health Training Center at Kothi.

K.M.Shah Dental College and Hospital is equipped with 350 dental chairs and 34 different clinics and laboratories. Departments have simulative labs, phantom heads and working models for preclinical learning.

Department of Pharmacy has 21 Laboratories and a drug information centre. Students do internship at industries to gain knowledge and skills.

The students of College of Physiotherapy, Department of Management, Sumandeep Nursing College and Department of Audiology & Speech Language pathology are posted at Dhiraj Hospital for their Clinical training.

There are skill labs in all the Institutes and Labdhi Simulation Centre is recognized by American Heart Association for conducting Certified BLS courses.

For AYUSH related learning cum therapy, there is an Ayurvedic Hospital attached to the Institution with one acre Herbal garden within the campus.

Greenery: Campus is replete with many well maintained landscaped gardens, lawns and greenery, playgrounds & herbal garden.

Alternate sources of energy: Roof top solar panels to generate 942KV energy. Biogas plants for generating gas from mess wastage.

Dhiraj Hospital which is a constituent of SBKS Medical Institute and Research Centre is 1350 bedded hospital with clinical departments, separate demonstration and procedure rooms for clinical and bedside learning. The hospital has more than 80% bed occupancy. 84 specialty clinics are run in the Hospital giving excellent clinical exposure to the students. There are separate operation theatres for all surgical departments. The hospital has central laboratory, central research laboratory and also offers super specialty training in many fields.

K.M.Shah Dental College and Hospital has 350 dental chairs with adequate patient inflow and various facilities for clinical teaching and learning with nine specialty departments having all the latest equipments.

College of Physiotherapy, Department of Audiology and Speech Language Pathology, Sumandeep Nursing College, Department of Pharmacy and the Department of Management have adequate equipment and facilities for as stipulated by regulatory bodies and are associated with Dhiraj hospital for fulfilment of clinical exposure and teaching learning activities.

- The appraisal form has questions of all the areas of academics, research, publications, recognitions, awards, other accolades, holding of important administrative posts etc.
- In case of nonteaching staff members, their dedication to work, punctuality, their behavior towards their juniors and seniors, understanding of the work they perform and their attitude toward learning and better performance in future are included.
- The filled appraisal forms are analyzed for the SWOC by the Head of the Department who verifies their performance in various parameters along with remarks.
- The HOI gives comment on the overall report of the individual and then sends it for further review by the Registrar and Vice Chancellor.
- The marks are given on the basis of their performance and the feedback analysis. The final report of performance of teaching and nonteaching staff members are recorded for the purpose of incentives, promotions and the salary

increments.

The annual budget of Revenue expenditure and capital Expenditure are recommended annually by the Finance committee and approved by the Board of Management. Generally recurring expenses and the capital expenditure are projected to be within the budgeted recourses of the institution. The Optimum Utilization of Resources is implemented by processes like Institution Budgeting, Budget monitoring by Finance Committee and Centralized purchase system.

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Sumandeep Vidyapeeth was established on 05/08/ 2013 and a full time Director has been appointed since then. Sumandeep Vidyapeeth has facilities for efficient management of different types of wastes generated.

Solid Waste Management:

The Institution has outsourced solid waste management by entering into contractual agreement with an external certified agency.

Liquid Waste Management:

The Institution has Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) Filtration capacity of 1.2 million liters per day. The liquid waste generated in different areas are treated to make it safe for utilization in gardening. Biomedical Waste Management:

The Institute has tied up with Quantum environmental engineers to handle biomedical waste as per standard protocols and guidelines. All generated biomedical wastes are segregated in colour coded standard polythenes placed over the dustbins in all the identified areas of Hospitals and Institutions premises.

E-Waste Management:

The institution has tied up with 'Greentech Recycling' an approved agency by Gujarat Pollution Control Board for disposal of E-Waste.

Hazardous Chemicals and Radioactive Waste Management:

The Hazardous chemicals and radioactive waste from hospitals, laboratories and pharmacy chemistry lab is disposed as per standard guidelines.

No radioactive waste is generated in campus. Radiation levels in the Department of Radiology, SBKSMIRC and Department of Oral Medicine and Radiology, KMSDCH are monitored regularly by means of Thermo Luminescent Dosimeter (TLD) badges.

Best Practice: 1

Title: Student Mentoring and Counseling System (SMCS)

For the smooth implementation of SMCS, The Institution has SMCS policy in place and a detailed Standard Operation Procedure. It has Chief Mentorship Coordinator at the Central Institutional level and Institute Mentorship Coordinators at every Constituent Institute level.

The Students categorized as Slow Performers and Mediocre learners are given opportunity to improve upon and overcome their academic weakness, they are given additional tutorials and training particularly from the `must to know' syllabus identified for slow performers and from the good to know syllabus for the mediocre learners in each subject. 7.3 - Institutional Distinctiveness

7.3.1 - Portray the performance of the Institution during the year in one area distinctive to its priority and thrust within 100 - 200 words

Sumandeep Vidyapeeth is distinct from other Institutions and universities, as it strives towards quality enhancement practices in health education, by following a unique type of teaching and learning method called Evidence-Based Education System (EBES). The performance of the EBES core committee during this year to achieve the objectives of EBES are as follows.

- 1. Total 52 newly appointed teaching faculty were trained for following evidence-based practice (EBP).
- 2. Total 5 PG capacity building activities were conducted in this academic year, total 100 post graduate students from all the institutes of Sumandeep were benefited.
- 3. On occasion of World EBHC day 2021, International Level webinar on "The Role of Evidence in an Infodemic" was conducted and total 194 delegates were sensitized regarding false medical data which can mislead us from giving proper medical care.
- 4. Undergraduate EBES modules were conducted as per the schedule in the constituent colleges of the institute.
- 5. JBI Collaborative activities: Our center was successful in securing 29,700 JBI points. gLocal solution room was created to spread awareness on Medication Errors in Developing Nations. Total 174 health care professionals were benefited from this.

7.3.2 - Future Plans of action for next academic year (100 - 200 words)

Sumandeep Vidyapeeth plans to begin four new constituent Institutes from the academic year 2022-2023. The Institution has planned to impart education and health services in traditional system and Indian medicines (AYUSH) by beginning two separate Institutes namely Sumandeep Ayurved Medical College and Hospital and Sumandeep Homoeopathic Medical College and Hospital. The Institution also plans to begin two new constituent departments namely Department of Prosthetics & Orthotics, and Department of Paramedical Sciences to augment the Health care education and services that is already being provided to the society with more focus on rural population. Various undergraduate and diploma programs will be started in the proposed institutes.

The institution has completed all the formalities to increase the intake capacity of MBBS students from 150 to 250 and is prepared to admit extra students from academic year 2022-23. The Institution is also constantly upgrading the facilities and area of the constituent Dhiraj Hospital. The Institution is in the process beginning Masters Degree in the Department of Audiology and Speech Language Pathology.
